**SRM University, Kattankulathur, Chennai (23.03.16)**

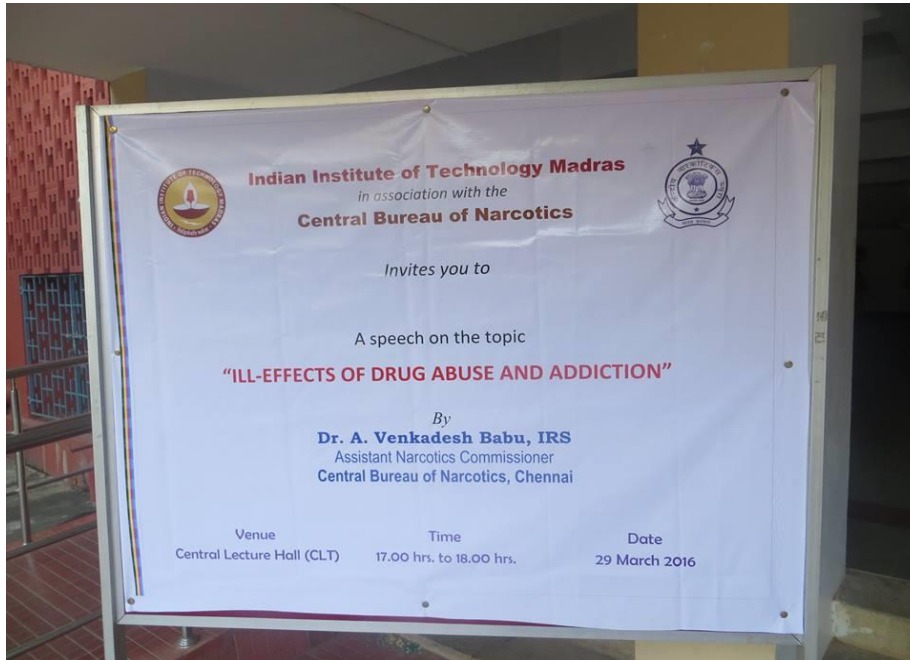

**Dr. M.G.R. Janaki College, Chennai (02.08.16)**

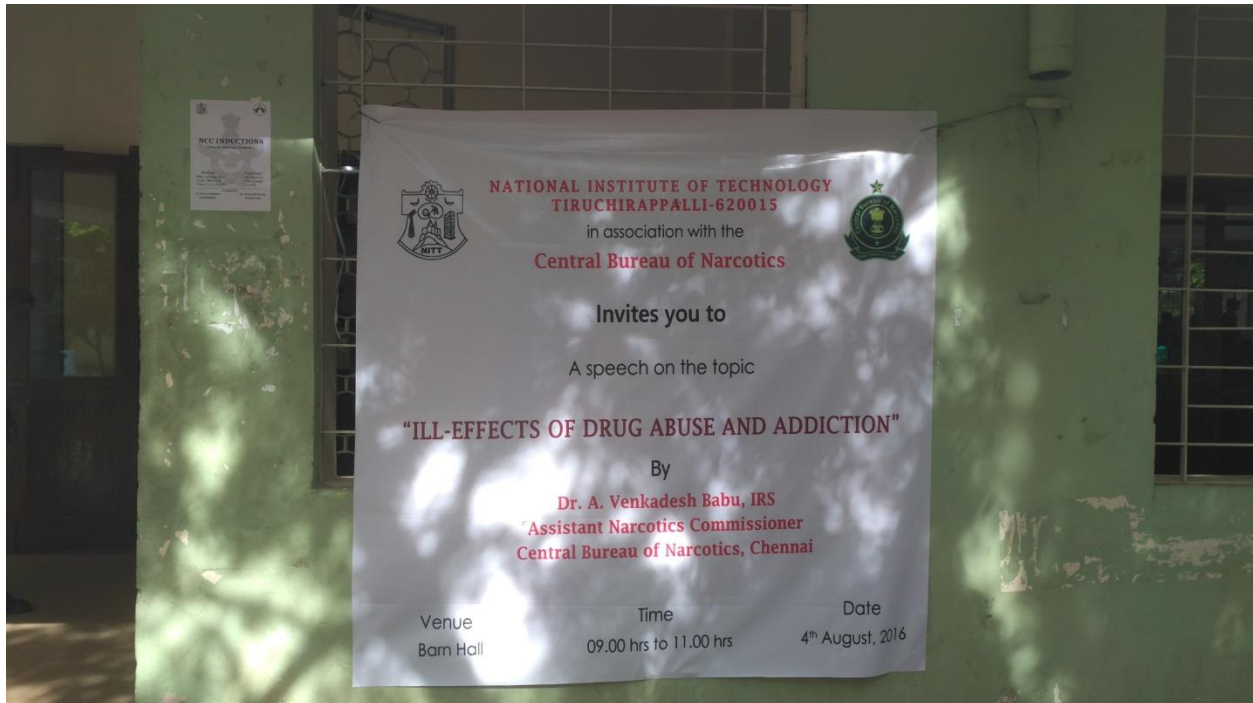
Dr. MGR Janaki College of Arts and Science for Women, Chennai. Around 500 students attended my speech on ill-effects of drug abuse and addiction.

## Vael's International School, Chennai (22.08.16)

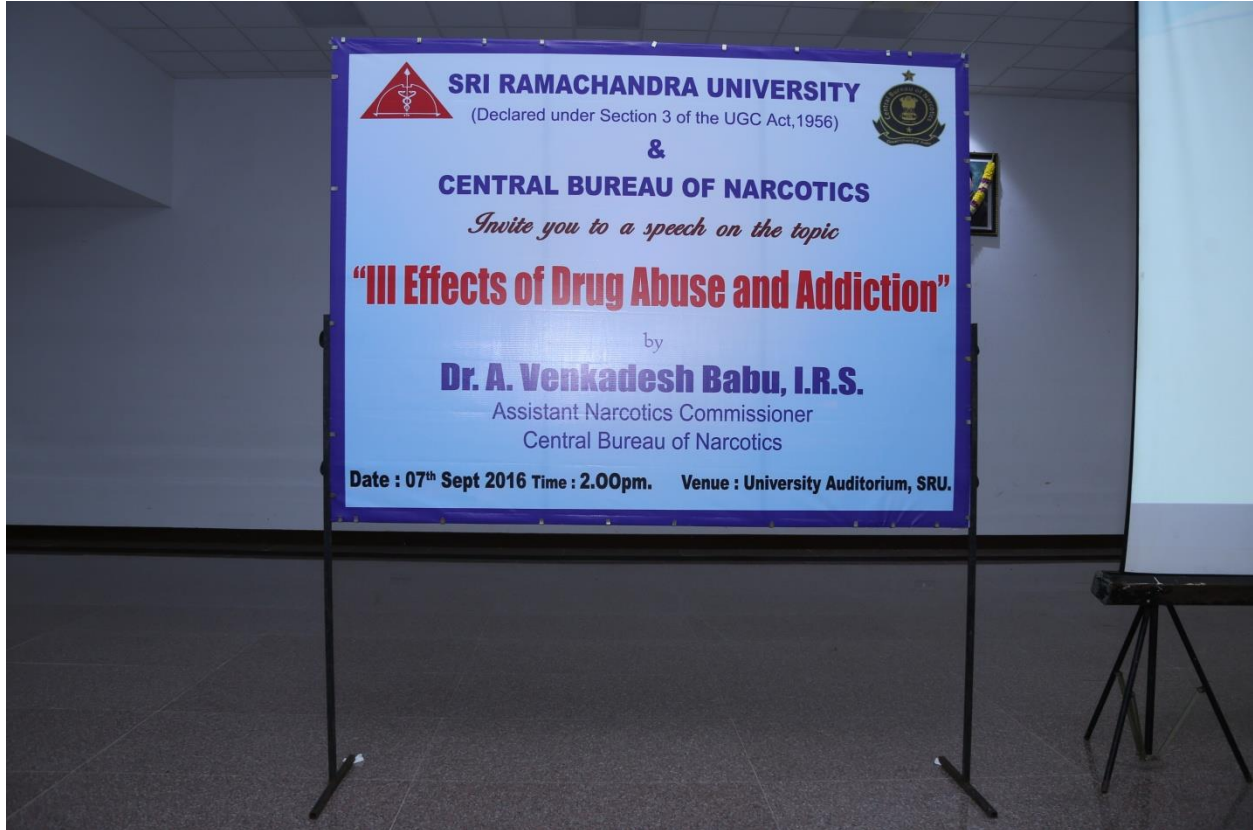

## Wipro, Chennai (19.9.2016)

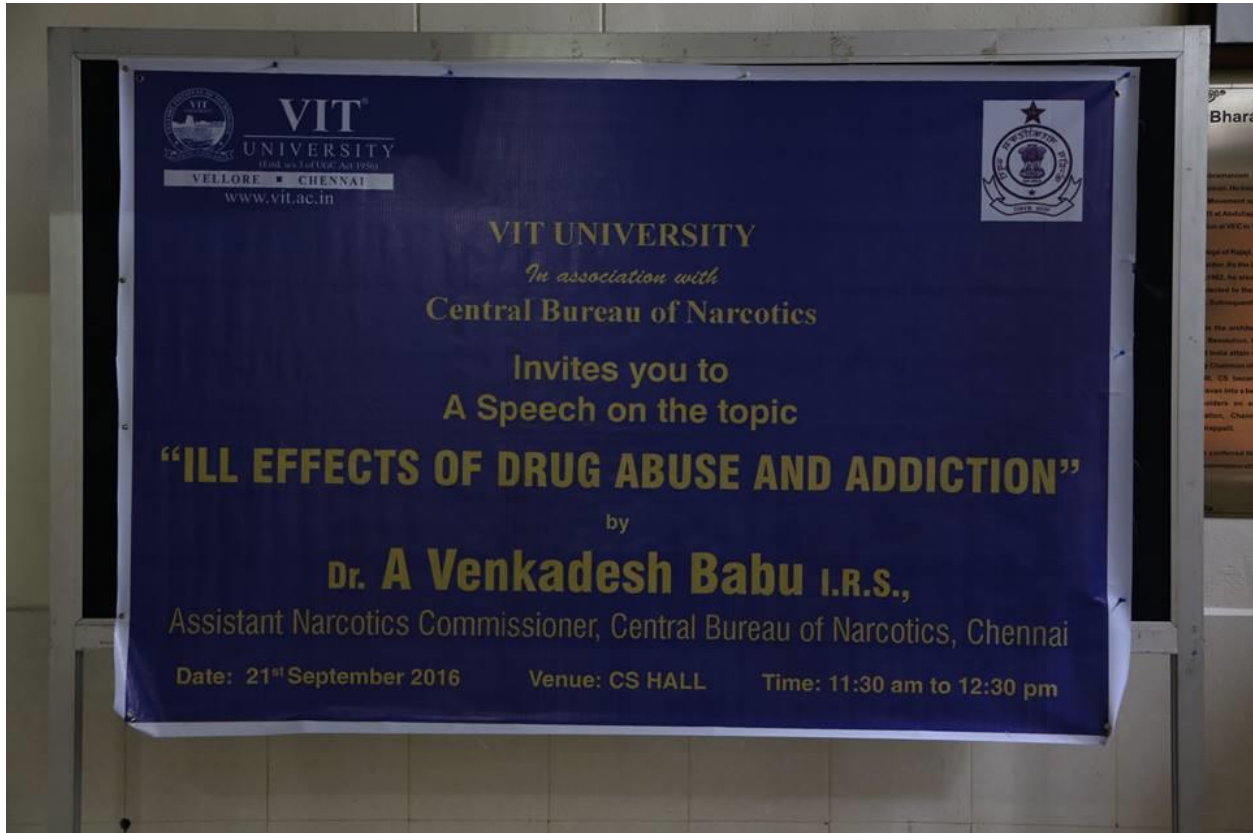

**KMCT, Calicut (28.9.16)**

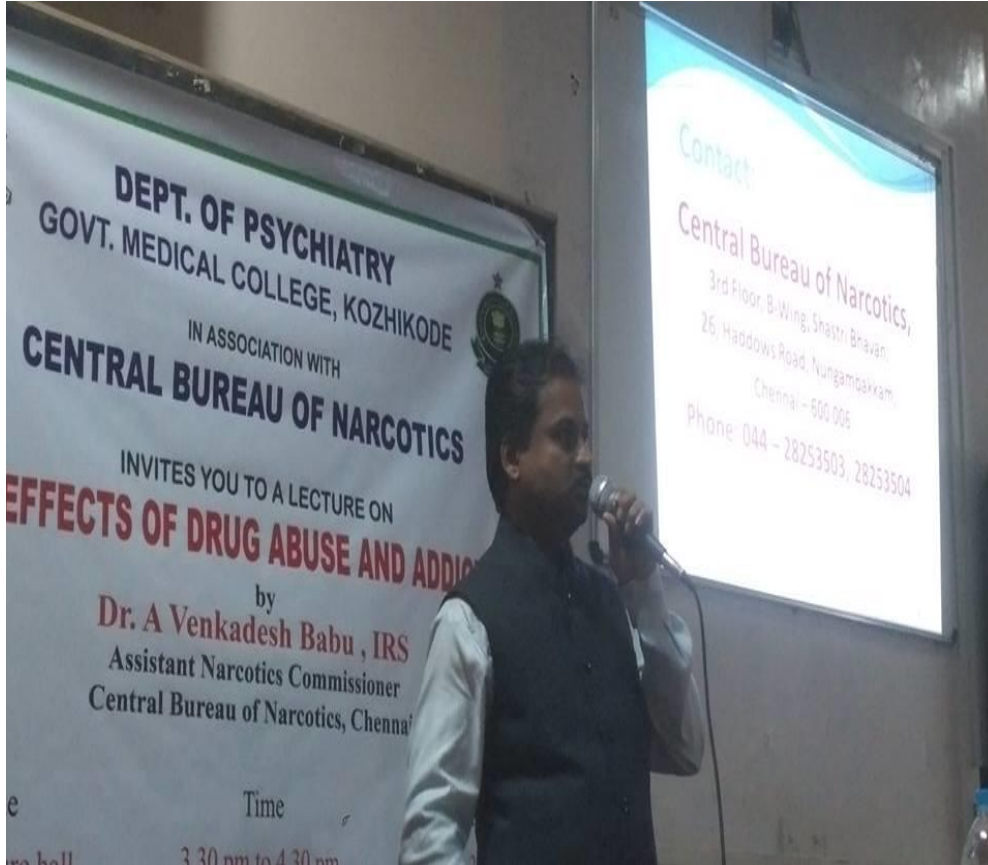

## Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai (18.10.16)

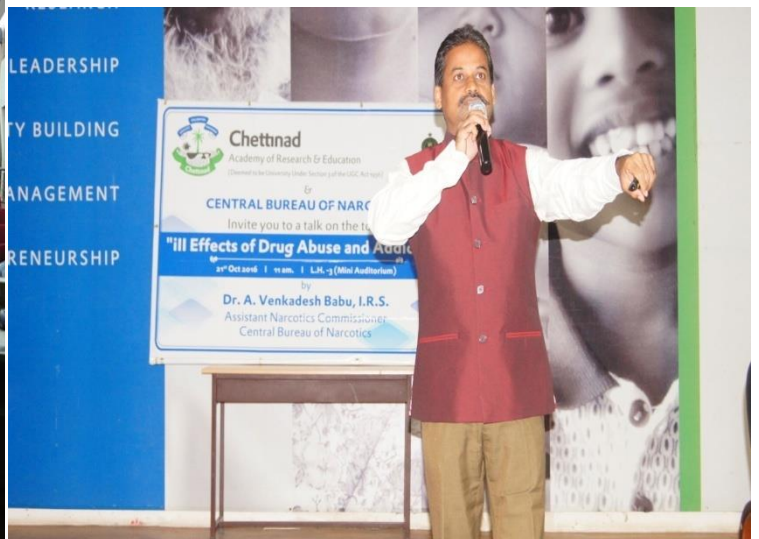

## Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry (10.11.16)

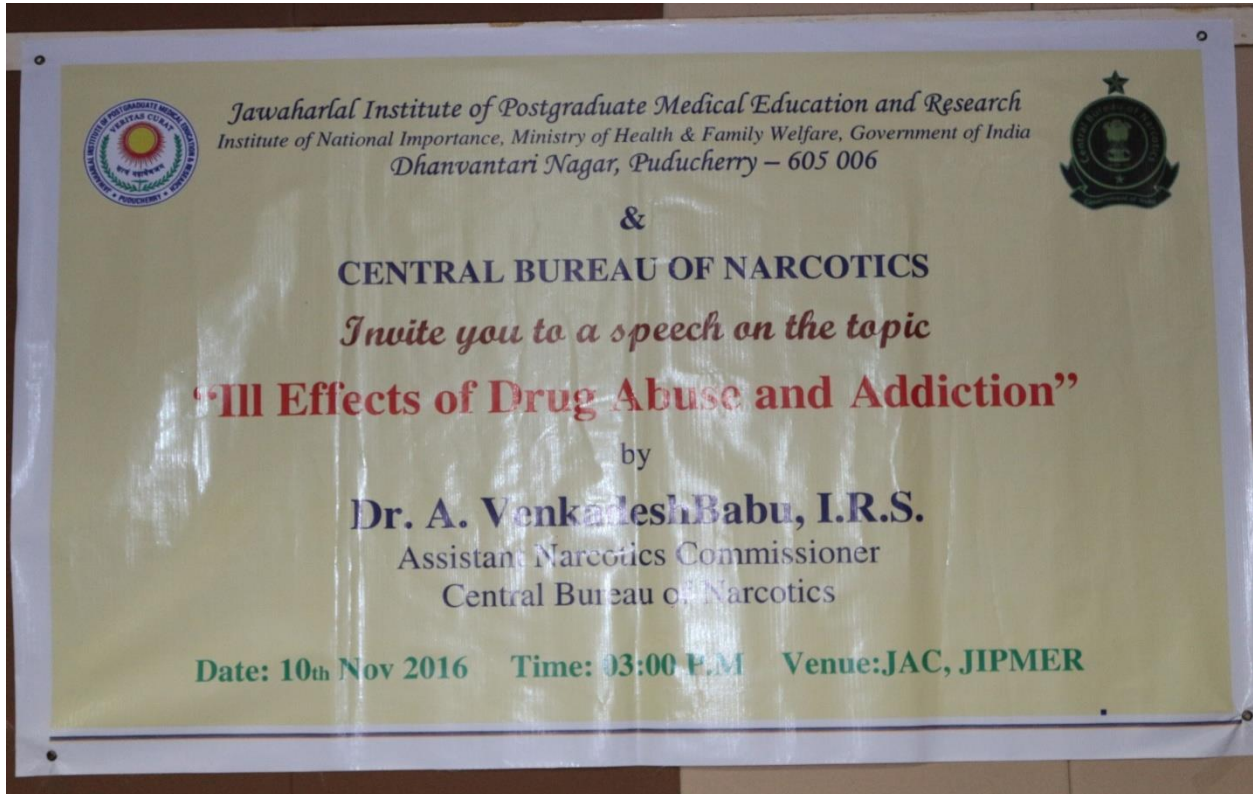

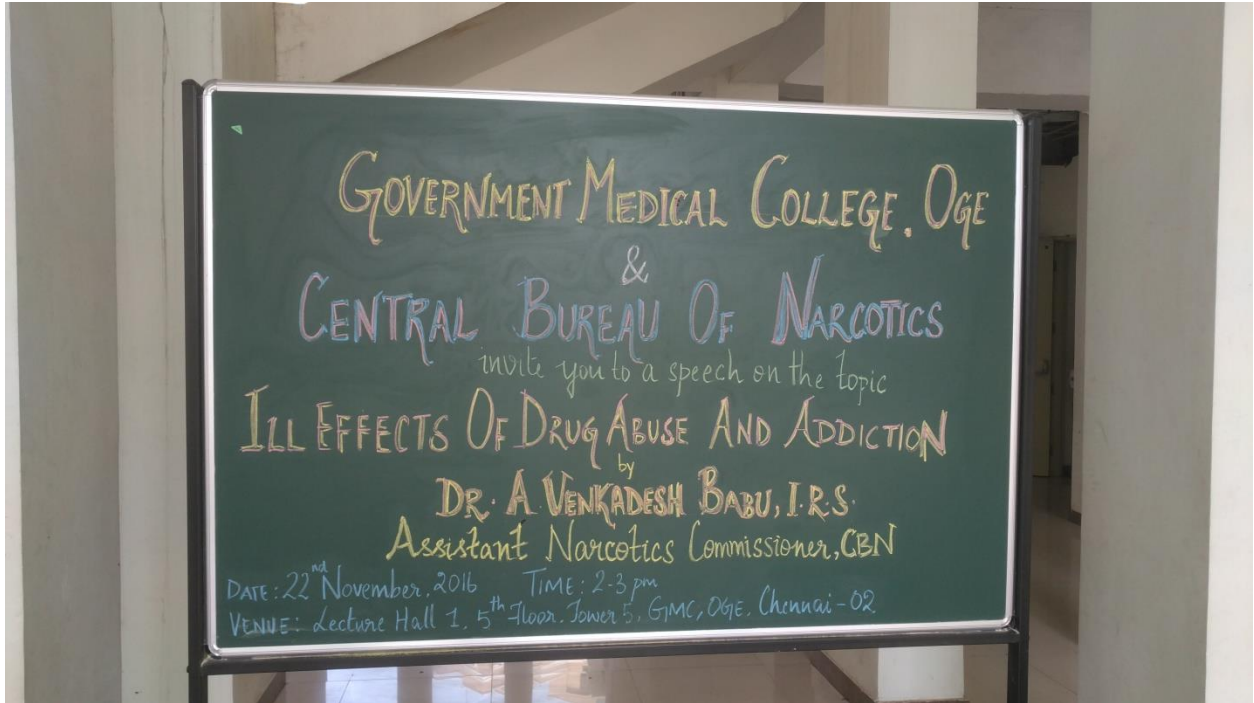
**Sri Lakshmi Narayana Institute of Medical Science, Pondicherry (11.11.16)**

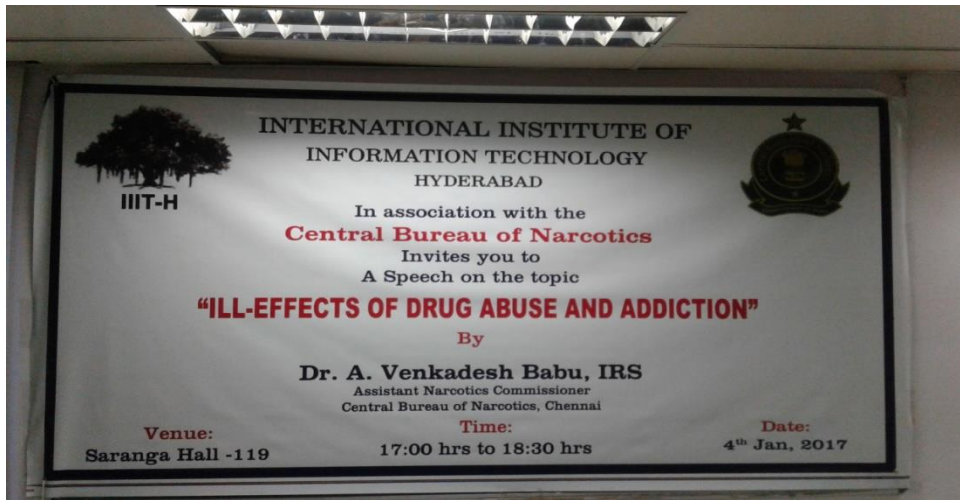
**Society for Promotion of Youth & Masses, Delhi (24.12.16)**

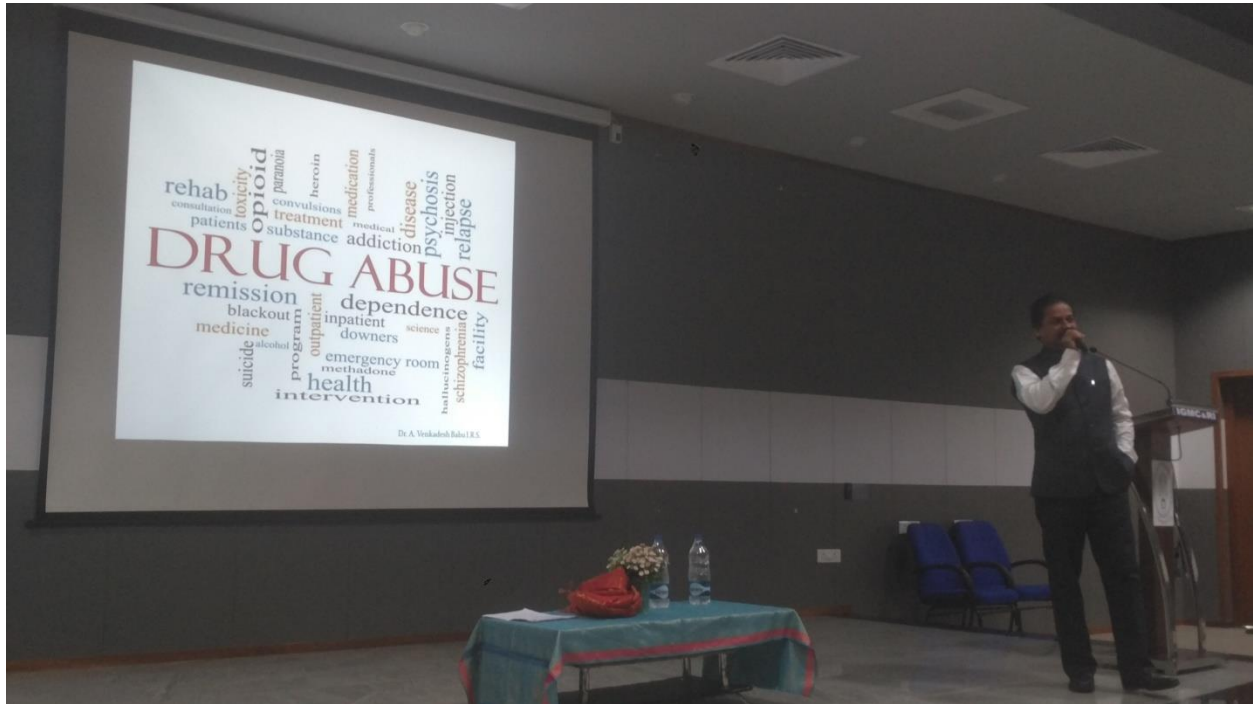
## **Mother Theresa Post Graduate & Research Institute of Health Sciences, Puducherry (9.1.17)**

**Army College of Medical Sciences, Delhi (18.1.17)**

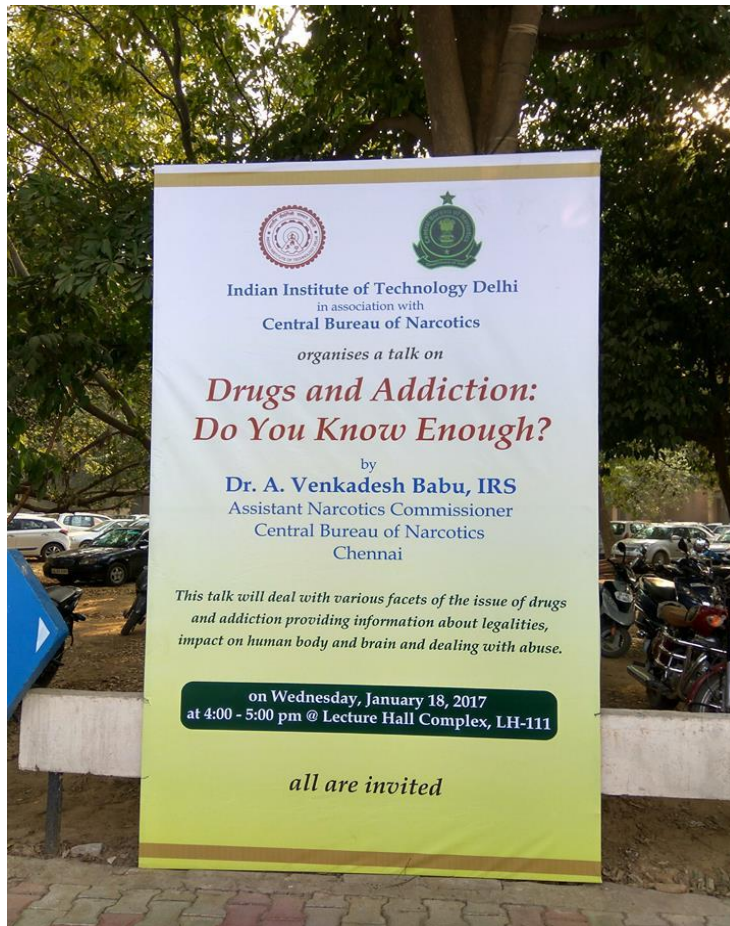

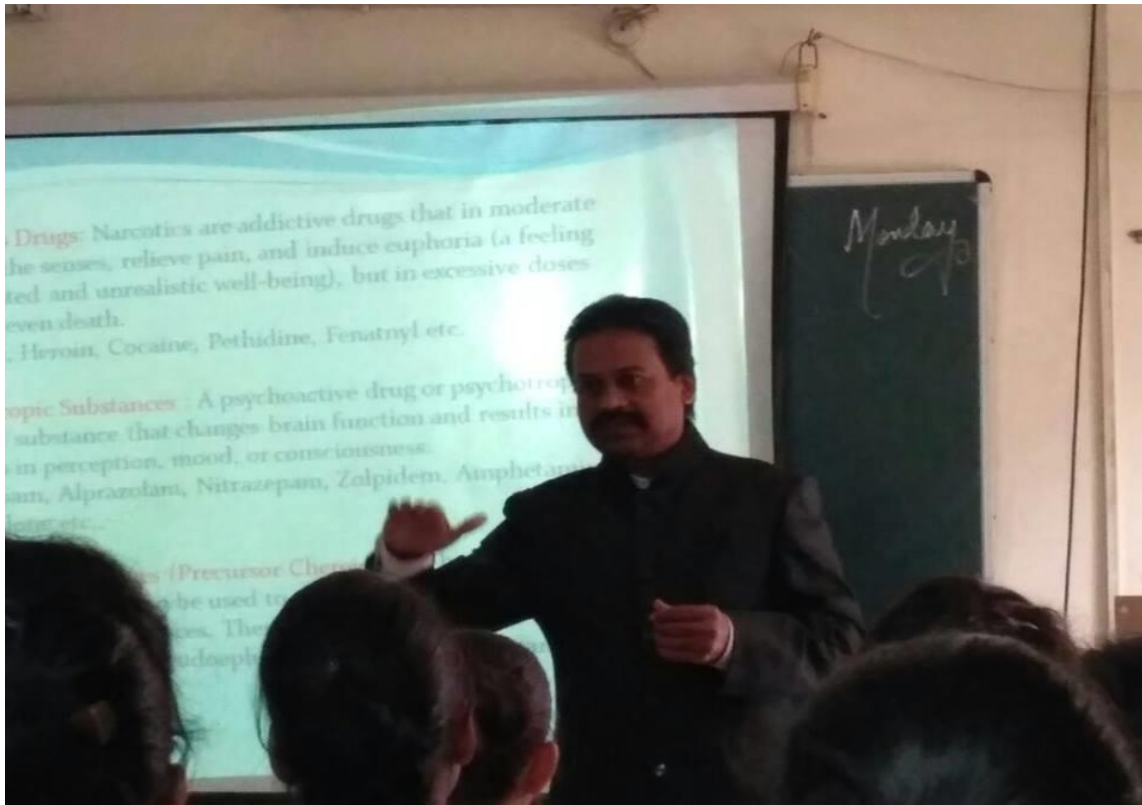
## IIT, Delhi (18.1.17)

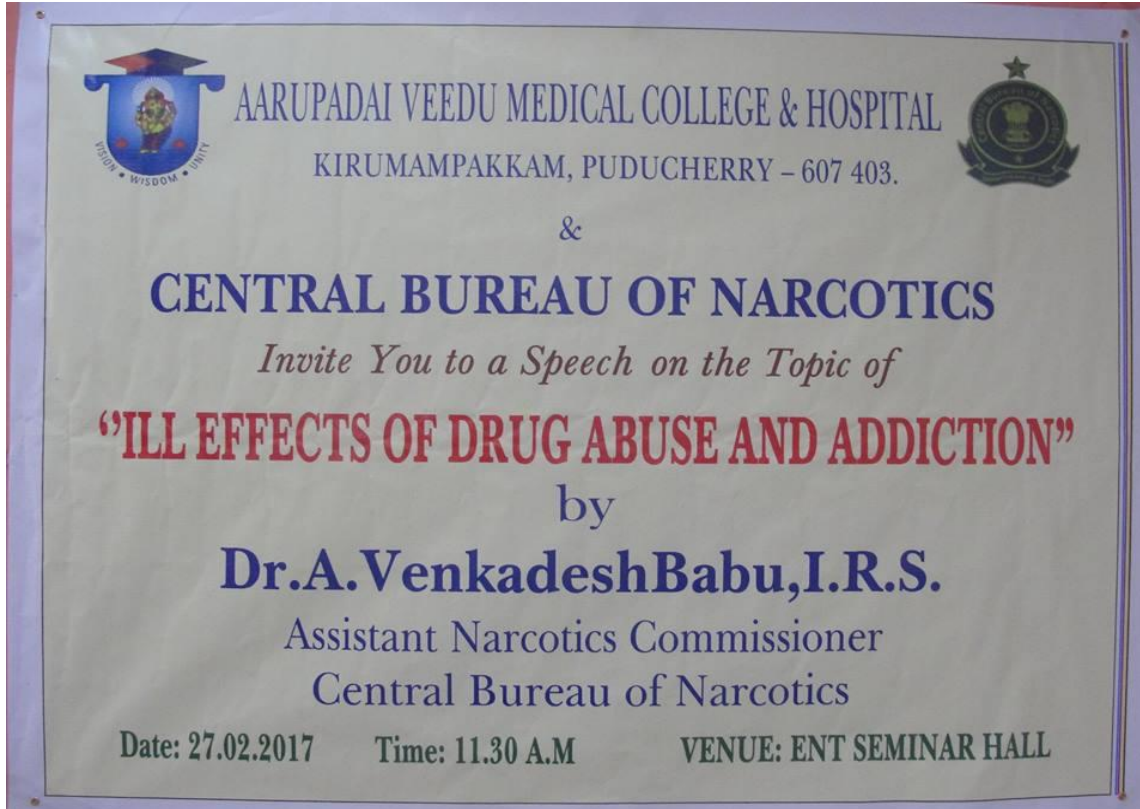
**Lady Doak College, Madurai (16.2.17)**

## The Study LecoleInternationale School, Puducherry (28.2.17)


